SECTION 4: First aid measures

4.1. Description of first aid measures

Inhalation : Remove victim to uncontaminated area wearing self contained breathing apparatus. Keep victim warm

and rested. Call a doctor. Perform cardiopulmonary resuscitation if breathing stopped.

Skin contact : In case of frostbite spray with water for at least 15 minutes. Apply a sterile dressing. Obtain medical

assistance.

Eye contact : Immediately flush eyes thoroughly with water for at least 15 minutes.

SECTION 5: Firefighting measures

5.1. Extinguishing media

Suitable extinguishing media : Water spray or fog.

Product does not burn, use fire control measures appropriate for the surrounding fire.

5.2. Special hazards arising from the substance or mixture

Specific hazards : Supports combustion.

Exposure to fire may cause containers to rupture/explode.

5.3. Advice for firefighters

Specific methods : Use fire control measures appropriate for the surrounding fire. Exposure to fire and heat radiation may

cause gas receptacles to rupture. Cool endangered receptacles with water spray jet from a protected position. Prevent water used in emergency cases from entering sewers and drainage systems.

If possible, stop flow of product.

Use water spray or fog to knock down fire fumes if possible.

Move containers away from the fire area if this can be done without risk.

Special protective equipment for fire fighters : Wear gas tight chemically protective clothing in combination with self contained breathing apparatus.

SECTION 7: Handling and storage

7.1. Precautions for safe handling

Safe use of the product

Use no oil or grease.

Use only properly specified equipment which is suitable for this product, its supply pressure and temperature. Contact your gas supplier if in doubt.

Do not smoke while handling product.

Keep equipment free from oil and grease. For more guidance, refer to the EIGA Doc. 33 - Cleaning of

Equipment for Oxygen Service downloadable at http://www.eiga.eu.

Avoid suck back of water, acid and alkalis.

Only experienced and properly instructed persons should handle gases under pressure.

Ensure the complete gas system was (or is regularily) checked for leaks before use.

The product must be handled in accordance with good industrial hygiene and safety procedures.

Consider pressure relief device(s) in gas installations.

Do not breathe gas.

Avoid release of product into work area.

Temperatures above 150°C (300°F) shall be avoided by all practical means, to reduce the likelihood of

an explosive decomposition of the nitrous oxide.

Clean all surfaces in direct contact with nitrous oxide as for oxygen service.

Nitrous oxide transfer pumps shall be provided with an interlock to prevent dry running.

Use self-limiting heating devices. Direct contact electric immersion heaters are not allowed.

Use only lubricants and sealings approved for the specific gas service.

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Safe handling of the gas receptacle

: Refer to supplier's container handling instructions.

Do not allow backfeed into the container.

Protect containers from physical damage; do not drag, roll, slide or drop.

When moving cylinders, even for short distances, use a cart (trolley, hand truck, etc.) designed to transport cylinders.

Leave valve protection caps in place until the container has been secured against either a wall or bench or placed in a container stand and is ready for use.

If user experiences any difficulty operating valve discontinue use and contact supplier.

Never attempt to repair or modify container valves or safety relief devices.

Damaged valves should be reported immediately to the supplier.

Keep container valve outlets clean and free from contaminants particularly oil and water. Replace valve outlet caps or plugs and container caps where supplied as soon as container is disconnected from equipment.

Close container valve after each use and when empty, even if still connected to equipment.

Never attempt to transfer gases from one cylinder/container to another.

Never use direct flame or electrical heating devices to raise the pressure of a container.

Do not remove or deface labels provided by the supplier for the identification of the content of the

oxygen.

In the presence of catalysts (e.g. halogen products, mercury, nickel, platinum) the rate of decomposition

increases and decomposition can occur at even lower temperatures.

Nitrous oxide dissociation is irreversible and exothermic, leading to a considerable rise in pressure.

Violently oxidises organic material.
